What is a Holy Day of Obligation?

Holy Days of Obligation are special celebration for which Catholics are obliged to attend Mass. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states: "On Sundays and other holy days of obligation, the faithful are to refrain from engaging in work or activities that hinder the worship owed to God, the joy proper to the Lord's Day, the performance of the works of mercy, and the appropriate relaxation of mind and body" (#2185).

Aside from every Sunday of the year, there are two Holy Days of Obligation in Canada. These are Christmas Day (December 25) and the Solemnity of Mary, The Holy Mother of God (January 1). These two holy days are to be observed each year, regardless of the day of the week.

Do I Have to Go to Mass Twice on December 24th? What about December 31st?

This year, the Fourth Sunday of Advent is also the Vigil of Christmas. Coming to Mass only for the Vigil of Christmas (Sunday evening) does not fulfill our obligation to celebrate the Lord's Day, Sunday. The same is true on December 31st: Coming on Sunday evening does not fulfill the Sunday obligation this year.

What about receiving Holy Communion twice in one day? I didn't think this was allowed!

A person is allowed to receive Holy Communion twice in one day, but it must be within the setting of the Celebration of Holy Mass. For this Christmas, if you come to Mass on December 24th in the morning for the 4th Sunday of Advent, you can then come and receive in the evening when we celebrate the Vigil of Christmas. Two different Masses, two different opportunities to receive Holy Communion.


